Risk Assessment Risikovurdering

Risk assessment is a Health and Safety term, which refers to the process through which hazards are identified, and the risks that they pose evaluated. What the law requires here is what good management and common sense would lead employers to do anyway: that is, to look at what the risks are and take sensible measures to prevent them.

A hazard is anything with the potential to cause harm. To consider:

- Physical (i.e. electrical, mechanical, noise etc.)
- Chemical (solids, liquids, gases etc.)
- Biological (bacteria, virus etc.)
- Ergonomic (fit for person to activity etc.)
- Psychological (stress, harassment, boredom etc.)

Identifying risks is accomplished by carrying out risk assessments. This is a requirement of **Management of Health and Safety at Work Regulations 1999,** and the school is obliged to keep written records of the risk assessments carried out. The frequency of certain risk assessments can be at the discretion of the employer.

Scale of risk

<u>Minor</u>- an incident or school related ill health, which results in staff or pupils being absent for less than three days.

<u>Significant</u>- an incident or school related ill health, which results in staff or pupils being absent for more than three days.

<u>Major</u>- an incident or school related ill health, which results in a person's death or the sickness of or injury to more than 15 people.

Risk assessments are conducted on an annual, biannual, monthly or weekly basis. In case of any significant changes, or after any incidents, a new risk assessment will take place.
